

Audition Guidelines: 2027 Entry Stage Two & Three: Recall

Congratulations! You've been invited to our two-part, in-person audition day.

We know auditions can feel high-pressure. We're interested in you as an individual. Stay relaxed, present, and open to the work.

Quick checklist

- Bring all three prepared pieces
- Wear comfortable clothing for warm-up
- Bring a packed lunch (not provided)
- Be ready to stay until 18:00 (some candidates may finish earlier)
- Review our programmes ahead of any interview

Stage two: recall (morning)

You will undertake a brief warm-up followed by an audition using your Stage One speeches. If you have worked on new material since then, you are welcome to bring it, but it's not required.

You should have the following pieces prepared for your Stage Two, but be aware we may not work on all three pieces:

Contemporary speech (max. two minutes)

We are interested in your ability to use your voice and physicality to connect emotionally with the character and the world they live in.

Verse speech (max. two minutes)

We are interested in your ability to work imaginatively with heightened text and to communicate images and stories truthfully.

Your choice (max. two minutes)

This is an opportunity for you to submit an additional monologue or to go beyond traditional audition material to express who you are as a creative artist.

If you are choosing not to present an additional monologue but something that expresses your artistic voice here are some suggestions:

- A piece of original music
- Spoken word or poetry
- A short film or digital piece
- A movement or dance work
- A self-written monologue
- Or any other form that best represents your artistic identity

Following stage two, there will be Q&A with some of our ambassadors and a tour of the building.

Stage three: recall (afternoon)

Not all candidates will be recalled for stage three. If you are not recalled, this does not necessarily mean your application is unsuccessful.

All recalled candidates will complete two exercises.

Exercise 1: speeches on screen

You will perform one of your monologues on camera. You may receive some direction. Try to keep the work fresh, alive and 'in the moment'.

Exercise 2: duologue piece

You will work on a short duologue, attached to this email. You can choose any one piece and then decide whether to read as character A or B.

For the duologue, you should be off book, or at least very familiar with the lines so that you can easily take your eye off the page. You should think about what motivates the character and what makes them behave the way they do. We will be looking at your ability to make choices, take on new choices and respond to direction.

Interview

A short, informal conversation about your aspirations, experience and suitability for our training. This is also your chance to ask us any questions.

Schedule

The day is separated into two parts for Stage Two and Stage Three of the audition. Not all candidates will be requested to attend the afternoon session. Timings may vary.

Piece 1
