

Interview Guidelines Online: 2027 Entry BA (Hons) Sound Technology

Congratulations on getting through to the interview stage.

If you live outside of the UK, we have automatically invited you to an online interview. If you would prefer to travel here to attend an in-person interview, please email international@lipa.ac.uk

We understand how nerve-wracking attending interviews can be. We will do all we can to help you feel at your ease throughout. A top tip is to read these guidelines thoroughly and to not leave anything until the last minute. This should help you feel calmer on the day.

Before the interview

Listening to and discussing a recording of your sound production work is an important part of the interview. As a back-up so we avoid technical issues with sharing your work on the interview day, we ask you to upload your recording via the applicant portal **at least five working days** before your interview.

The recording should be **no longer than four minutes** in length and should demonstrate your skills in recording music. It can either be a recording of someone else's music performance or your own.

Please submit this as a **single WAV file (44.1 kHz and 16 bit)**. Please name the file clearly in the format SURNAME-FORENAME.WAV.

If you have experience in live sound, you are welcome to submit a portfolio in pdf format, showing photographs and other relevant information of live sound projects you have worked on. This is an optional extra, but if you do have live sound experience, we'd love to talk to you about it. The portfolio can also be uploaded through the applicant portal.

Interview format

Our online interviews will take place on Microsoft Teams. You will be allocated an interview time and date, typically with a minimum of two weeks' notice. Times are GMT or BST as appropriate.

Our online interviews will usually be one to one and typically last 30-40 minutes.

Your interview will be led by one of our Sound Technology teaching staff and is very much a two-way process, so as well as us finding out more about you, you can also learn more about us, how we teach Sound Technology here and what our studios, performance spaces and equipment are like.

Just as we would at an in-person event, we will be encouraging you to talk about what attracts you to our course and to share your long-term career aspirations.

Following this we will play your recording and ask you some question about it. We are primarily interested in your ability to discuss and analyse your recording, so don't worry if you think your recording wasn't perfect. Our questions usually cover areas such as the equipment/software you used, the techniques you applied and maybe how you think the recording could be improved. If your experience is primarily in live sound rather than recorded sound, we will base our questions and discussion around the pdf portfolio you sent to us.

At the end of the interview, you'll have ample time to ask any questions you have. You may also wish to chat with a current student to hear about their experiences of studying here and of Liverpool. If you'd like to do this, please get in touch using the contact details listed at the end of these guidelines.

Tips for taking part

- You will need a good internet connection and access to Microsoft Teams, which is the video conferencing platform we will be using.
- You should ideally use a PC or Mac running Microsoft Teams. The device you use will need to have a screen, microphone and a webcam. If you have any concerns about your equipment for taking part in the virtual interview, please get in touch using the contact details at the end of these guidelines.
- On the day, please ensure you are in a quiet room, where you will not be disturbed during the interview event.
- Please ensure you are in a well-lit space so you can be clearly seen and heard during your virtual interview.
- Test your camera and microphone before your virtual interview and clean the camera lens.
- Make sure your device is fully charged and/or is plugged into a power source.

When will you hear from us after the interview?

We need time to reflect on the candidates we've seen, so we do not tell you the outcome of your interview on the day itself. We don't like to keep you waiting though, so we always aim to communicate our decision to you within 10 working days of attending your interview.
