

Audition Guidelines: 2023 Entry

Thank you for your interest in training with us – we're delighted to let you know that you are through to the first stage of our two-part audition process. If you normally live in the UK, you will be invited to attend the first available in-person audition event at LIPA.

At all stages of the audition process we may consider you for any of the following undergraduate Acting courses:

- BA (Hons) Acting
- BA (Hons) Acting (Screen)
- CertHE Foundation Acting (Stage & Screen)

There is **no audition fee** for any stage of our audition process (travel grants are available and are applied automatically, if you live in an eligible postcode).

Guidelines for your Stage One in-person audition

We understand how nerve-wracking the prospect of auditioning can be, so please read these guidelines carefully. Being able to follow instructions is an important part of being an actor.

Remember we're interested in finding out about you as an individual, so please try to relax, be yourself and enjoy the day.

Schedule

08.30-09.00 Registration

09.00-09.15 Welcome and courses overview talk

09.30-13.30 Individual audition, workshop and building tour

Between these times, you will undertake your individual audition, take part in a group workshop and have a building tour. We will be seeing quite a lot of candidates, so you may

experience some periods of waiting around.

13.30-14.15 Lunch break

Lunch isn't provided, so please bring a packed lunch.

Some candidates may be asked to attend an afternoon session.

14.15-17.30 Afternoon call back session

This will involve re-presenting one of your prepared pieces. Not all candidates will be requested to attend the afternoon session, and this does not constitute a recall audition. If you are not asked to stay behind, you may still be offered a recall audition at a later date.

What to prepare

Please prepare three pieces:

1. Contemporary speech (no longer than 2 minutes)

Please choose a speech from a play written after 1960. This play should reflect your own age and life experiences. We recommended that you use a monologue in which your character is talking to another character in the play for two minutes, without them exchanging dialogue with you in that time, rather than a character that is talking to the "audience" for two minutes.

2. Verse speech (no longer than 2 minutes)

Please choose a two-minute verse speech, which demonstrates your ability to interpret heightened forms of speech and to communicate images and stories. Your selection is not restricted to conventional verse (i.e. Shakespeare), but can include contemporary verse, such as works by Inua Ellams and Kae Tempest. The verse speech may be, but is not limited to:

- Classical poetry
- Twentieth century poetry
- Spoken word
- Shakespeare
- Elizabethan
- Jacobean
- Restoration

3. Self-created piece (no longer than 2 minutes)

Please create and perform an original piece in response to a newspaper article. Here are a few hints and tips to help you create this piece:

- Ensure your piece expresses an essential quality of who you are, and where you believe your place is in the world you inhabit.
- Avoid a 'talking head' performance piece. In other words, don't just perform the piece as merely a spoken monologue, try to turn your ideas into performed images.

- Movement, sound, spoken word, song, music and gesture can all be part of your self-created piece.

Each of your three pieces should be no longer than two minutes. The panel may stop anyone who goes over that time.

Workshop

This is led by a member of the Acting staff. There is no need to prepare for this, but please aim to engage with it as fully as possible.

Building tour

You'll get to see our facilities on a tour given by one of our current Acting students who will also answer any questions candidates may have about what it is like to study at LIPA.

Clothing

Please wear loose clothing, comfortable for movement. Please do not wear jeans or other restricting clothes. You may also be asked to work barefoot. If for medical reasons you cannot work barefoot, then please ensure you have appropriate, flat footwear.

After the audition

We do not tell you the outcome of your audition on the day itself. We will let you know if we are inviting you to the recall audition with plenty of time to prepare. We usually do this via email.

If you have been unsuccessful at the first stage audition, we will inform you via UCAS, our applicant portal and email. Unfortunately, due to the high volume of applications we receive, if you are not successful we are unable to offer feedback.

Recall auditions

A selection of candidates will be asked to come back at a later date for a recall audition, where we will ask you to present your contemporary speech and to take part in a short TV/Film extract working with a LIPA student. You will also take part in workshops on the day. The recall guidelines will be emailed to all invited to a recall.

We have introduced some exciting new courses in Acting (Musical Theatre) and Acting (Musicianship), if you were unaware of these courses at the time you applied but are interested in these please let us know at your first stage audition. We may be able to invite you to a recall for one of these instead.

Do you have any access needs related to a disability that may require specialist arrangements?

Applicants unable to travel to LIPA

The best way to get a feel for what it is like at LIPA is to attend an in-person audition event.
