Module Content

Outline Syllabus

Unit 1: Relevancy - Contemporary Policy and Practice

This module will be delivered in two strands. A series of lecture/workshops will introduce key theory and policy debate whilst a second strand of seminar sessions will introduce students to current critical language and writing styles through analysis and discussion of journal articles and policy documents.

Unit 2: Realisation - Employment and Enterprise

This unit will focus on a range of selective and competitive processes students are likely to encounter within the broad ATCD, including the completion of a funding bid. In addition, a series of masterclasses will be held prepare students to make informed decision regarding incorporation/formal business structures. Finally, students will engage in a practical interview/tendering exercise.

Unit 3: Repertoire - Drama Workshop

Each weekly session will focus on two key drama skill areas with every student preparing and submitting a plan for a one hour workshop to address each skill. Two students will be chosen at random to deliver their workshops each week ensuring each student delivers at least one workshop by the end of the module.

Module Overview

This module focuses on the key processes that support professional as a facilitator/director. Units explore how to keep work relevant, build repertoire and bring professional plans to realisation.
