

## **In-Person Interview Guidelines: 2027 Entry BA (Hons) Theatre & Performance Design**

Congratulations on getting through to the interview stage.

Most of our interviews will take place between November and March. If you are able to attend an interview in the UK, you will be able to select an interview date from your applicant portal by following the link in your invitation email.

We understand how nerve-wracking attending interviews can be, and we will do all we can to help you feel at ease throughout. A top tip is to read these guidelines thoroughly and to not leave anything until the last minute. This should help you feel calmer on the day.

Our highly practical course enables you to develop and hone your skills as a designer for performance. By working on our extensive programme of productions, you become a versatile practitioner, who feels equally at home designing for theatre, film and TV, dance, music and site-specific performances. Our approach allows you to create your own pathway and curate a compelling CV and portfolio that matches your ambitions.

The degree is integrated in part with the Theatre & Production Technology degree, to share knowledge and skills across the two complementary areas.

Our interview event is designed as a two-way process. We are aiming to offer you the opportunity to discover if our course is right for you, while we try to determine whether you have the qualities to benefit from what we have to offer.

### **What to prepare for the interview**

Please bring the following with you to your interview:

#### **1. Portfolio**

Please bring a portfolio of your design/artwork with you. This should include a wide range of work (including evidence of 3-D projects if possible), which demonstrates your ability to work with different materials and your potential to develop ideas. You may include work from live performance projects or exhibitions, but it is not essential.

## **2. Written review**

Please bring a written review of a performance you have seen recently. In your review, please concentrate on reviewing the visual elements and style of the production. The review should be no longer than 500 words.

## **On the day**

Please arrive at the time stated in your invitation email. You should expect to be with us for up to **four hours**; there will be some waiting at the individual interview stage, and some candidates will finish earlier than others.

## **Registration**

Please use our entrance on Pilgrim Street, where you will be met by our Admissions staff.

## **Building tour and course talk**

This is a short tour of our building and facilities. You are not being assessed during this. We include it in the event to help give you a better insight into LIPA and our teaching spaces. After your tour, the Head of Theatre Performance Design & Production Technology and the Course Leader for Theatre & Performance Design will give a short introduction to our degree programmes. They will describe what we do and how we do it and what life as a Design student here is like.

## **Individual interview**

You take part in a 25-minute interview with members of our teaching team. We ask you to present a portfolio of work which you have created or helped to realise and to discuss any projects you have been involved in. We may also ask you further questions to help you and us to assess your suitability for our degree programme.

Your interview will be led by one of our Design staff and is very much a two-way process, so as well as finding out more about you, you can also learn more about us and how we teach Design here.

We will be encouraging you to talk about what attracts you to our course and to share your long-term career aspirations.

At the end of the interview, you'll have ample time to ask any questions you might have. You may also wish to chat with a current student to hear about their experiences of studying here and of Liverpool. If you'd like to do this, please get in touch using the contact details listed at the end of these guidelines.
